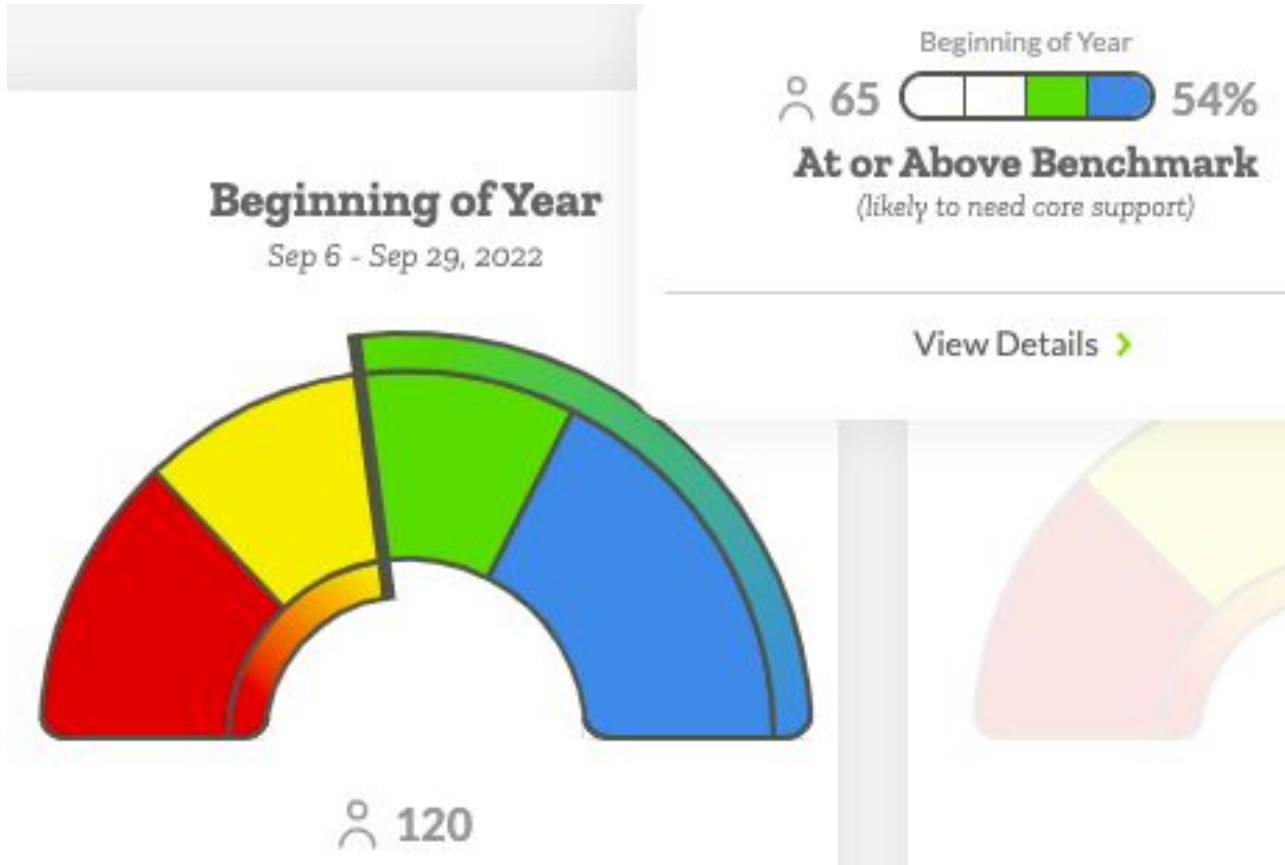

Look at data in May to plan instruction and guide interventions in the fall as soon as students return.

By end of year 2023-2024, 74% of K-3 students (80% of Kindergarten and First grade students) will be at benchmark using Acadience Data.

By 2024

1. The decision rules need to be reviewed and updated by grade level teams. Also create a bank of resources and strategies for specific Interventions aligned to skill deficits.
2. Analyze Tier 1 program by skill. One skill focus each year to develop strategies, interventions, and routines.
3. MTSS established for collaboration time looking at data and strategies implemented.

By end of year 2024-2025, 80% of K-3 students will be at benchmark using Acadience Data.

By 2025

1. Observe other schools that have used 95% and (learning walks) have the data to support their accomplishments.
2. Utilize 95% Group CORE with fidelity for a minimum of 3 years.
3. Establish grade level PLC and have learning walks.

Achievement



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By 2023, we will increase the number of indicators met from 2 to 6 on state tests. An increase in Advanced Plus (1.3 points), Advanced (1.2 points), and Accomplished (1.1 points).

By 2024, we will increase the number of indicators met from 6 to 8 on state tests. An increase in Advanced Plus (1.3 points), Advanced (1.2 points), and Accomplished (1.1 points).

By 2025, we will increase the number of indicators met from 8 to 10 on state tests. An increase in Advanced Plus (1.3 points), Advanced (1.2 points), and Accomplished (1.1 points).

Achievement Component

- The Achievement Component measures students academic achievement using each level of performance on Ohio's State Tests.
- Measures students' academic achievement elements on the state tests
- Rating based only on **Performance Index!** This is where we can maximize our outcome.
- Tested areas: grades 3-12 (ELA, Math, Science, & HS Gov)

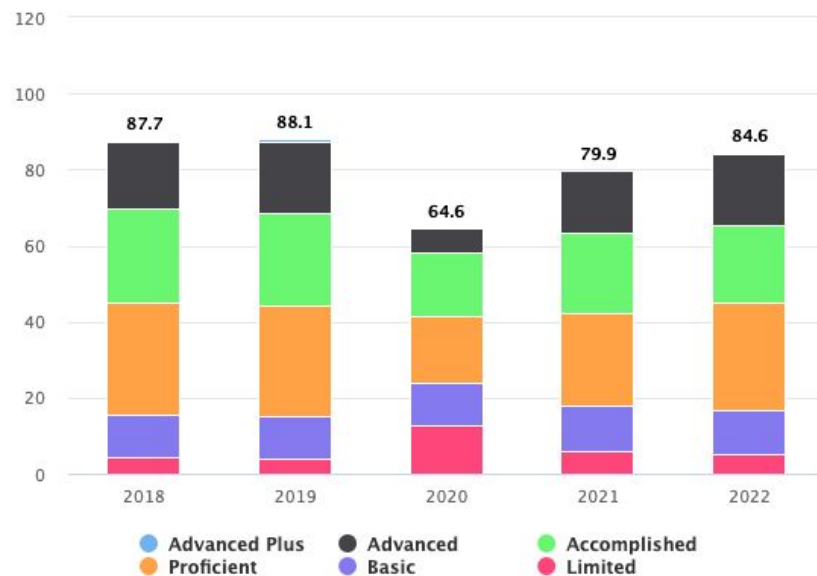
